At the bottom of the page is a list of websites you can search for the best prices for your textbooks. When you are shopping for books, keep the following points in mind:

- 1. Search for your books by their ISBN number to be sure you buy the right edition of the book. You can even google the ISBN number.
- 2. Once you buy a book from one of these sites, you may or may not be able to return it. Read the fine print for each site to find out. Usually you have to return it within a certain time period. Returning books may or may not be a problem. Occasionally, professors changes their mind about using a textbook.
- 3. Order your books a couple of weeks before the semester begins so you're sure you have them for the first class. It may take a week for them to arrive.
- 4. Renting textbooks is sometimes an option. You should not rent, however, if it is a lab book, for example, that you need to write in.
- 5. You may be able to buy books from other students. Again, make sure you check the ISBN number so you're sure you have the right edition. Professors may change to a more updated version from one semester to another.
- 6. Some of the sites will buy your books back from you at the end of the semester; though at a lower price than what you bought them.
